

Boosting English proficiency

CAMBRIDGE English For Life (CEFL) partnered with Pertubuhan Kemajuan Sosial Malaysia (PKSM) to provide a morning of English lessons for over 100 students in Klang. This event is part of CEFL's ongoing Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) efforts.

The lessons, conducted in conjunction with the school holidays, were held at the Sri Murugan Centre in Klang.

Participants, who ranged from students in Forms One to Four, were guided by four teachers from CEFL.

These students came from various schools within the Klang district.

Among the activities held were quizzes, storytelling, role-playing, and spelling bees, specially designed to strengthen the students' English communication skills.

CEFL Chief Executive Officer Dr Elsie Chin said that the language centre hoped to work closely with PKSM to "positively impact the community".

"By organising a morning of fun English activities for these students, we aim to

highlight the importance of learning English and why it is essential for them to grasp the language at this tender age.

"Through interactive activities carried out by our experienced teachers, we want to stir the interest of these students and motivate them to want to learn more about the language when they return to school next month," she added.

Sri Murugan Centre provides free English classes for the Indian community in various neighbourhoods in the Klang Valley.

Classes start in December and run through to September every year.

CEFL has previously participated in CSR projects with Sri Murugan Centre to provide free English lessons for underprivileged students.

In July this year, classes were held every weekend for 70 Year Six pupils from SJK (T) Vivekananda over four weekends.

This was followed by free English classes over five weekends for 140 Form Three students in August and September this year, also held at SJK (T) Vivekananda.
